We are trying to have the journal approved for inclusion in the Index Medicus. That will enable our younger and talented colleagues to be counted as members of the International Medical Community.

Our policy is not to alter the textual contents of any manuscript, however, we shall be taking the liberty of rectifying any errors of typing, punctuation, grammer or syntax. We trust authors would not consider it an unreasonable interference.

May I reiterate that our aim is to encourage research, authorship and dissemination of knowledge. Your contribution to that end is keenly awaited. I
